The International Politics major provides students with a broad, comprehensive education in international relations, foreign policy, and the politics of other nations. Majors take courses in international and comparative politics, as well as in economics, geography, and history.

III. SUPPORTING COURSES (12 credits)

Up to 12 credits of foreign language courses beyond the 12th-credit level can be used. Only 9 of the 12 credits in a foreign language must be at the **400 level**.
